#### **Declaration of Danielle Tarantolo**

#### Danielle Tarantolo, declares:

- 1. I am the Director of the Special Litigation Unit at the New York Legal Assistance Group (NYLAG).
- 2. My colleagues at NYLAG and I litigated and served as class counsel in the 2014 federal class action lawsuit against ASA College, *Frica Sanchez v. ASA College, Inc.* 14-cv-5006 (S.D.N.Y.), along with our co-counsel Emery Celli. This lawsuit alleged that ASA engaged in a scheme to draw millions of dollars of federal and state financial aid to ASA at its students' expense, and to their detriment, by means of systematic and fraudulent misrepresentations to accreditors, government entities, students, and the public.
- 3. The lawsuit resulted in a settlement in April 2016. Under the settlement, ASA committed to change certain of its business practices.
- 4. My colleagues at NYLAG and I were involved in monitoring ASA College's compliance with those obligations during a 3-year post-settlement period.
- 5. My colleagues at NYLAG and I have spoken to hundreds of ASA students over the last ten years.
- 6. Many students have reported that they were misled by the school and its agents, and that many of the representations ASA made to get the students to enroll turned out to be false.
- 7. I make this declaration based on investigations that my office conducted in connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, personal knowledge gained through my involvement in the lawsuit, review of relevant documents, and consultation with relevant NYLAG staff whom I supervise, including staff who have spoken regularly with ASA students over the past 10 years.

#### Misrepresentations about Job Placement Rates

- 8. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that ASA College fraudulently calculated high job placement rates for its graduates and that it submitted these rates to accreditors and advertised them to the public.
- 9. Specifically, NYLAG determined that, during the time period before NYLAG filed the *Frica Sanchez* complaint, during that lawsuit, and during the 3-year post-settlement monitoring period, ASA's job placement statistics were misleadingly calculated because they systematically excluded large numbers of unemployed ASA graduates, in addition to

- employed graduates whom ASA failed to place. The result of excluding these graduates was to make the job placement figures appear artificially inflated.
- 10. The *Frica Sanchez* complaint alleged that ASA fraudulently calculated its job placement statistics by consistently excluding students who were pressured or deceived into signing waivers that allowed them to be excluded from mandatory reporting to accreditors. ASA also inflated its job placement rates by excluding students it deemed to have voluntarily left the workforce even when those students had been unable to obtain employment. ASA improperly excluded many students whom it incorrectly categorized as non-citizens lacking work authorization, and by categorizing an implausibly high number of students as having moved out of state, such that they did not have to be included in reports to accreditors.
- 11. The complaint also alleged that in addition to excluding large swaths of its graduates from job placement calculations, ASA inflated these rates by improperly counting graduates who were employed in jobs outside the field which ASA supposedly prepared them for; graduates in unpaid, part-time, or temporary jobs; and even graduates employed in administrative jobs at ASA itself. ASA hired many of its graduates to work as recruiters whose compensation was structured on an illegal enrollment quota and bonus scheme which served to funnel new students into the school.
- 12. During the post-settlement monitoring period, NYLAG determined that ASA remained out of compliance with the terms of the settlement agreement because ASA continued to publish and advertise false job placement rates. On its website, ASA claimed a 79.1% "job placement" rate for its graduates. Elsewhere on its website, ASA reported that 11 out of 12 of its programs had "employment rates" that were 75% or lower. "Job placement" and "employment placement" are terms of art; graduates who are "placed" for purposes of "job placement" are not necessarily considered "employed." "Job placement" is a limited and defined subset of "employment placement," such that the job placement rate must logically be lower than the employment rate.
- 13. ASA reported these fraudulently calculated job placement rates to accreditors and advertised them to attract prospective students.
- 14. Attached as Exhibit 1 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's website from October 2013 which states that ASA College has an "83% job placement rate."
- 15. Attached as Exhibit 2 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's website from July 2017 which states that ASA College has an "83% job placement rate."

16. Attached as Exhibit 3 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's website from 2017 which advertises that "79.1% of ASA graduates [are] employed within one year of graduation."

#### Misrepresentations about Lifetime Job Placement

- 17. Both before the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit and, on a regular basis until as recently as 2022, ASA College advertised and purported to offer "lifetime job placement assistance."
- 18. But in connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that ASA could not and did not provide its graduates with lifetime job placement assistance.
- 19. Specifically, NYLAG determined that even for those ASA students who received some job placement assistance right after graduating, ASA stopped provided that assistance as soon as the students were outside of the 3-year post-graduation window on which ASA was required to report to its accreditors.
- 20. Throughout the 10 years during which my colleagues at NYLAG and I have spoken to former ASA students, no graduates have reported to us that they received lifetime job placement assistance.
- 21. The *Frica Sanchez* complaint alleged that ASA was unable to provide lifetime job placement assistance. At the time of filing, the ASA Career Services office was understaffed, with each member being responsible for hundreds of ASA's approximately 9,000 students, and an exponentially greater number of its graduates.
- 22. Additionally, under the *Frica Sanchez* settlement, ASA committed that, if it advertised that it provided lifetime job placement assistance to graduates, it must, in fact, provide such assistance. Advertisements from as recently as 2022 indicate that ASA continued to falsely promise lifetime job placement assistance to students.
- 23. Attached as Exhibit 4 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's website from October 2013 that advertises "lifetime job placement assistance" and a "guaranteed externship" as reasons to study at ASA College.
- 24. Attached as Exhibit 5 is a true and correct photo of an ASA advertisement from 2022 displayed in a New York City Subway train car that advertises ASA's "job placement services."
- 25. Attached as Exhibit 6 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's X (formerly "Twitter") page from 2022, which advertises "lifetime job placement assistance for all ASA College graduates."

26. Attached as Exhibit 7 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's Facebook page from 2022 which advertises that ASA offers "lifetime job placement assistance."

#### Misrepresentations about Guaranteed Externships

- 27. Both before the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit and during the 3-year post-settlement monitoring period, ASA advertised to prospective students that it guaranteed externships with leading companies.
- 28. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that these statements were false and misleading.
- 29. Specifically, NYLAG determined that ASA students were not guaranteed externships, and that, even if ASA students did get externships, they were not with leading companies.
- 30. Attached as Exhibit 8 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's website from October 2013 that advertises its externship program which purported to place students with "leading companies in their selected field of study."
- 31. Attached as Exhibit 9 is a true and correct copy of an ASA flyer distributed in March 2018 that advertises a "guaranteed externship for all degree programs."

#### Misrepresentations about Guaranteed Employment

- 32. Before the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, ASA advertised that students who studied at ASA College would be guaranteed employment upon graduation.
- 33. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that these statements were false and misleading, because ASA students were not guaranteed employment after graduating.
- 34. Attached as Exhibit 10 is a true and correct photo taken in October 2013 of an ASA advertisement located in a New York City Subway car that advertises "20+ job placements each week in [a student's] field of study."
- 35. Attached as Exhibit 11 is a true and correct photo taken in 2014 of a sign on an ASA building displayed to the public that advertises "20+ job placements each week in [a student's] field of study."
- 36. Attached as Exhibit 12 is a true and correct photo taken in 2014 of a sign on an ASA building displayed to the public that has an arrow leading from the word "Education" to "Jobs."

#### Misrepresentations Specific to the ASA Nursing Program

- 37. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that ASA misled prospective Nursing students by falsely advertising what salary a graduate of the Nursing program might expect to make.
- 38. As recently as 2022, ASA advertised that the "starting median annual wage for registered nurses/RN is \$73,000 [and] the annual wage for an RN nurse with 3 years of experience is about \$110,000."
- 39. These salary figures, even if true as a general matter, were not representative of what graduates of ASA's Nursing program could expect to earn. Gainful Employment data demonstrate that the median wage of graduates of ASA's nursing program was only \$51,724 three years after graduation less than half of the wages ASA advertised.<sup>1</sup>
- 40. Attached as Exhibit 13 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA's LinkedIn page from 2022 which advertises the salary expectations for nursing graduates.

#### Misrepresentations about Accreditation

- 41. NYLAG determined that ASA College misrepresented its accreditation status to prospective students, including via its website, social media pages, and advertisements, during the periods before, during, and after the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit.
- 42. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that ASA misrepresented its accreditation status as being in good standing because that standing was based on the fraudulently calculated job placement rates it submitted to accreditors.
- 43. Additionally, in 2017, ASA represented that it was accredited by the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS).
- 44. But this was a false representation, since ASA stopped being accredited by ACICS in August 2016.
- 45. Attached as Exhibit 14 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA's website in January 2017 which states that ASA was accredited by the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS).

- 46. Attached as Exhibit 15 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA's Facebook page in January 2017 which states that ASA was accredited by ACICS.
- 47. Attached as Exhibit 16 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA's LinkedIn page in January 2017 which states that ASA was accredited by ACICS.

#### Additional Misrepresentations by ASA:

- 48. In connection with the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit, NYLAG determined that ASA regularly used advertisements to prospective students that contained other misrepresentations, indicating that doing so was central to the school's business model.
- 49. Both before the *Frica Sanchez* lawsuit and as recently as 2022, ASA misrepresented to prospective students that they offered free English-as-a-Second-Language (ESL) courses.
- 50. These statements were false, because ASA did not, and was not authorized to, offer stand-alone ESL courses. The ESL courses it did offer were not "free," but were covered by state and federal grants so long as the student was also enrolled in another ASA program.
- 51. Specifically, the *Frica Sanchez* complaint alleged that ASA lured students with the promise of such classes and then convinced them instead to pursue other educational programs and take ESL classes in addition.
- 52. Attached as Exhibit 17 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA's website in January 2017 which advertises "Free ESL classes."
- 53. Attached as Exhibit 18 is a true and correct copy of a screenshot of ASA College's X (formerly Twitter) page from 2022 which advertises "Free ESL workshops."
- 54. Additionally, ASA College, in its advertisements and promotional materials, misled prospective students by suggesting that enrolling at ASA could allow students to change their immigration status.
- 55. Attached as Exhibit 19 is a true and correct copy of a flyer published by ASA College in 2018 advertising its English Language Program. The flyer states that a prospective student could "change your status with no legal fees."
- 56. Attached as Exhibit 20 is a true and correct photo from 2022 of an ASA advertisement displayed in a New York City Subway car that states ASA students can "stay legally in America."

- 57. Finally, ASA College falsely advertised that ASA students could receive a gift of \$4,000 to \$8,000 upon graduation.
- 58. Attached as Exhibit 21 is a true and correct photo from 2022 of an ASA advertisement displayed in a New York City Subway car which advertised that ASA students could receive a gift of \$4,000 to \$8,000 upon graduation.
- 59. Throughout the 10 years during which my colleagues at NYLAG and I have spoken to former ASA students, no graduates have reported to us that they received such a gift.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

#### STUDENT ADVISEMENT SERVICES

Every student is assigned a dedicated ASA advisor who functions as a mentor throughout the student's stay at the college. Advisors assist students to identify and achieve their goals.
